Douglas W. Bostick
Executive Director and CEO of the SC Battleground Preservation Trust

Douglas W. Bostick is a native of James Island and is an 8th generation South Carolinian. His South Carolina ancestors date back to colonial America, including the secretary of the Sons of Liberty during the Revolutionary War. His earliest ancestors arrived in America at Watertown, Massachusetts in 1641. Bostick is a graduate of the College of Charleston and earned his master's degree from the University of South Carolina. He is a former staff and faculty member of the University of South Carolina and the University of Maryland.

Bostick is the author of 26 books, and his knowledge of history is enhanced by a raconteur's gift for storytelling. He speaks

on a wide range of topics related to Southern and South Carolina history. His book on the Morris Island Lighthouse was the "2009 Book of the Year" for the Foundation for Coast Guard History. Bostick's books on the Fort Sumter National Monument and the Grand Traditions of Charleston Cuisine were both selected as Book of the year by the Wholesale Book Dealers Association in their respective year of publication.

Doug Bostick currently serves as Executive Director and CEO of the South Carolina Battleground Preservation Trust. In that position, he serves as co-director for the South Carolina Liberty Trail, and interpretive trail of Revolutionary War sites in the state.

ABOUT THE CAPITAL CITY CLUB

The Capital City Club was established in 1988. President Carl Brazell said at the time, "It will be a club where character and success, not race or creed, are the criteria for membership." Today, the Club has more than 1,400 members and is generally acknowledged to be one of the most successful clubs in the state.
